Donors and volunteers are stepping up in big ways to fill a great need!

Motivated to end the now 100+ person waiting list, they are eager to do
their part to get more children and adults access to the innovative healing
that happens every day on the back of our horses.

As a result, NTRC began planning for a \$5 million expansion that will utilize the newly acquired property to the south of our campus. This expansion will significantly impact our future programming capacity. Over the next three years, our plan is to build an additional barn and covered arena, expand program support space and provide barn staff housing. This will address the waiting list, enhance delivery options for our core programming and grow our newly launched and future services.

To help lead our efforts, volunteer, donor and Operation Strides participant, Joe Logrippo, has joined the Board of Directors and stepped up to chair the expansion committee. He not only brings first-hand knowledge of the benefits of time with our herd to his role, he has extensive expertise in fundraising, sales and financial planning.

At this year's Barn Dance, donors stepped up in a big way raising \$337, 250 in the Fund-A-Need which benefited the new five-stall barn and the addition of four new therapy horses. Five couples earned the naming rights to the stalls. We are grateful to those who have supported us so far and look forward to working with our invaluable donors to achieve this exciting state-of-art expansion and vision for the future.

Meet a Rider

THERAPEUTIC RIDING OFFERS HOPE, CONNECTION AND IMPROVEMENT

I have always loved riding. I treasure the memories I have riding trails with my family as a child and in college. Due to a long, difficult and painful road of chronic illness, riding became a distant memory. My illness took years to diagnose, and resulted in almost complete disability and painful social isolation.

When my neurologist ordered physical therapy to help with my posture, balance and gait, I went to each session and did my very best, but most of the results proved fleeting. When I told him of my passion for horses, he told me about NTRC. When I got the call after waiting nearly two years, I couldn't wait to begin.

With immaculate grounds, beautiful horses, well-equipped arenas and welcoming staff, I quickly realized that NTRC is its own community and I felt like I was about to become a part of something extraordinary. After not riding for 20 years, I was able to manage the basics pretty well, but my illness presented new challenges including balancing problems and chronic joint pain.

Since I began riding at NTRC, I have sensed a noticeable improvement in my posture and balance. I now ride independently, feel more confident in my abilities and maintain correct posture, more often than not, in everyday life. This has reduced my pain, and my doctor is extremely pleased with my progress.

Riding at NTRC has given me opportunities to make new friends who understand what it's like to live with invisible disabilities. My connection to the people, the bond I have with Fancy and the time I spend at NTRC, give me a wonderful sense of belief in myself again, as well as hope and excitement for the future.

ENDING THE WAIT TO RIDE MOTIVATES VOLUNTEER INTO LEADERSHIP ROLE
