A group of FGCU college students, ages 19-23, have become supporters of our mission thanks to a course that encourages students to create a positive impact on their community.

The students were enrolled in a civic engagement class that requests students find a community partner to engage and interact with in order to promote the quality of life of their community. The group adopted NTRC after attending a service learning fair on campus. At the event, our volunteer coordinator encouraged our next generation of leaders to learn about the benefits of equine therapy.

The students were intrigued, did their research and voted hands down to partner with NTRC for their project. The group decided started by volunteering on campus doing activities that maintained our beautiful campus including painting fences, cleaning paddocks and doing tasks that make the workload less for our staff.

GROWING UP WITH NTRC HAS SHOWN THIS TEEN WHAT'S POSSIBLE

I was born premature and spent the first seven weeks of my life in the hospital. When I was one, I was diagnosed with cerebral palsy. This effects my posture, strength, and mobility.

When I found out about NTRC in 2106 when I was 13 years old, I was over the moon that there was a therapeutic riding center that was consistent and didn't cost a lot of money! I couldn't wait to start and see how it could help my condition. I've been riding weekly ever since.

The bond I had with my horse Comet was awesome. I just loved seeing his cute face every time I walked up the ramp for my lesson. With Comet's help, I can now straighten my head and back, and not lean over to one side. My legs are stronger too. This has built my confidence in my abilities to do rudimentary tasks that I do every day in life. I can walk better and control my movements.

It means so much to be part of this unbelievable, kind-hearted community. It gives people who are willing to help others a way to help people like me. Everyone involved cares about helping people. That's why NTRC is so important.

I think my future looks bright. I am going to walk. I am going to college. I'm going to become an actor. Now that I am an adult, my goal is to be independent and go on my own. I'm going to do all this stuff. I am so grateful. Without NTRC's donors and volunteers none of this would be possible. You have given me an opportunity that I didn't even think was possible.



## Caring for Our Horses

**Q: WHAT DO YOU NEED TO CARE FOR THE HERD?**

**A:** Hay, feed, and supplements cost roughly \$4,800 per month. Their care includes a farrier service that costs \$2,500 per month.

We also provide chiropractic care, massage, and Magna wave therapy as needed. With your support, we make sure the horses are in their best condition to serve our riders.

## Volunteer Spotlight

### VOLUNTEER RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION EFFORTS PAYING OFF

After promoting Amy Burrell-Cormier to Volunteer Manager last summer, she hit the ground running meeting our hundreds of dedicated volunteers and listening to their needs. From that feedback, she created new opportunities and initiatives to help enhance our volunteer program to accommodate our growing service needs.



“NTRC can’t meet its mission without volunteers. Our riders can’t ride without them,” shared Amy. “Growth is a reflection of the health of an organization as well as its reputation in the community. Ensuring volunteers have a meaningful experience is critical to our recruitment and retention efforts.”

The changes Amy implemented have created more opportunities for connection – connection with riders and families, with other volunteers and connection to our mission. Scheduling changes encouraged volunteers to sign up for 8-week sessions in the same time slot so they can work with the same rider and horse each week. Community building events such as the new Food Truck Fridays, provide opportunities for riders, families, volunteers and staff to engage with each other in a social setting outside of lessons.

These efforts have paid off. Since August, the NTRC Family has grown by more than 160 volunteers! They are learning about NTRC by word of mouth from other new volunteers and outreach fairs where our best mini ambassadors Itty Bitty and Raisin are making the call for volunteers an easy sell. If you have a servant’s heart, volunteering at NTRC is a great place to invest your time – no horse experience needed.
